Commercial and Intellectual Property Litigation. Carson litigates a wide range of business/commercial disputes involving fraud and misrepresentation, breach of contract and fiduciary duty, business interference, unfair competition, unfair and deceptive trade practices, and inter-entity disputes, including LLCs and partnerships. Carson also represents commercial landlords in disputes concerning lease and license agreements, tenancy, and real estate matters.

As part of his intellectual property practice, Carson represents clients in disputes involving patents and trade secrets across various industries and technologies, including cases involving trade secret misappropriation, patent infringement, and challenges to the validity of patents. Carson represents clients before state and federal trial and appellate courts, and in *inter partes* review proceedings before the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) of the USPTO.

Employment Litigation and Advising. Carson defends businesses in state and federal court, and before the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination (MCAD). Carson has represented employers in litigation involving allegations of harassment, discrimination, and wage and hour violations, among other employment-related claims. Carson also defends and advises businesses and individuals concerning employment contracts, wage and hour compliance, and non-competition and non-solicitation agreements (restrictive covenants), and compliance with other state and federal statutes. Carson frequently drafts employee handbooks, employment agreements, separation and severance agreements, non-disclosure agreements, and other employment agreements.

Financial Services Litigation. Carson defends financial institutions and loan servicers in various matters involving alleged loan servicing violations, contested foreclosures and evictions, lender liability, mortgage lending and fraud, alleged predatory lending, municipals liens and claims including code violation matters, condominium, tax and other priority liens, receivership, takings/eminent domain, and debt collection and collections activities, among others.

Prior Experience. Prior to joining Eckert Seamans, Carson practiced with a Boston firm where he defended clients in product liability and commercial litigation cases throughout New England. He also served as

a judicial law clerk to the Justices of the Massachusetts Superior Court. During law school, Carson was a senior staff editor of the Northeastern University Law Journal and served as a judicial intern to Chief Justice Scheier of the Massachusetts Land Court.
